COMMUNION ON THE LAWN AND MANITOU DAYS PET PARADE

Please bring a blanket or lawn chair to our outdoor service at 10 am on Sunday, June 24th. We will gather around the front lawn Celtic cross for a casual Communion liturgy. This will be followed by our Manitou Days Pet Parade which will begin at 10:45 am.

We will have a registration table set-up; after registering, line up with your beloved pet at 2nd & Clark for the parade. We will walk south on Clark Avenue toward Lake Avenue and then circle back to the church. If you don't have a pet, help cheer our walkers on in this unique community event. The parade will be followed by the clergy of St. John's offering a Franciscan Pet Blessing.

Pets of all kinds are welcome, but we do ask that they are vaccinated, well socialized, and leashed or caged. We encourage you to dress your pets (and yourself, if you like) in costumes. Once the Pet Blessing is done, we will have the judging for the optional Pet Contest. There will be five categories in this contest: Smallest Pet, Largest Pet, Most Unique Pet, Best Costume, and the Pet Who Most Resembles Their Owners. Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in each category. Judges will be Ramsey County Commissioner Victoria Reinhardt; Community Volunteer Jan Holtz Kraemer; Rep. Carol McFarlane; Fire Chief Tim Vadnais, White Bear Lake Mayor Paul Auger, and Town Life Publisher Catherine Carey.

Keyboard Concert with Layton "Skip" James, June 3

Please join Layton "Skip" James, principal keyboard artist of the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra at 4 pm Sunday, June 3 at St. John's, for a program of hymns, poetry, and music; their history, effects on the human psyche, origins in various historical traditions; how famous composers used them as raw material for organ and choral music; and how they influenced the course of history. We will see how hymns were used in education, to celebrate the seasons of the liturgical year, and to commemorate historical events. We'll also explore the more subtle types of hymn notation, including Gregorian notation, shapenote, versification patterns, tune names, and the history of hymnals.

This may sound like a college course, but Skip will delve just deep enough to provide the tools to do some exploration on your own, and "a foretaste of the feast to come" if you decide to go deeper.

June 3rd is Trinity Sunday, and Skip will also choose some seasonal hymns to play for a hymn-sing. What do you need to bring to a hymn-sing? 1) your heart, soul, & the willingness to use your voice, 2) your ears & brain, and 3) your curiosity. Of course there will be opportunities to sing your favorites too.

A free will offering will be taken, and a portion of the proceeds will go to support our Episcopal Youth Music Camp. A meal in the Parish Hall will follow the hymn sing.

This program is rated for people of all ages, so bring the kids!

STATUS REPORT: THE CAMPAIGN FOR ST. JOHN IN THE WILDERNESS

In 2005 The Campaign for St. John in the Wilderness was conducted. We received pledges of gifts that totaled \$770,700 against a goal of \$750,000. We are pleased to report that \$631,400 of the planned \$770,700 has been collected so far.

You will recall the campaign was conducted for three primary reasons:

- To perform much needed maintenance on our historic old church
- To jump start several new programs in the parish by providing program funds and the staff to run the programs, at least during the start up phase
- To add to our Endowment Funds, which are managed by the Saint Paul Foundation, and thereby provide a larger and more stable supplement to the Annual Budget

We are pleased to report that the following projects for building restoration and repair have been completed:

- Roof repair
- Security System
- Air Conditioning Installed
- Sound System Installed
- Plastering and Painting

Our goal was to raise \$150,000 for repair and maintenance projects. This work is essentially complete and we have spent \$104,500.

The goal for new programs was \$350,000. The money for new programs has been used as follows:

- Provide partial funds to hire The Revs. Joanie Delamater and Marilyn Baldwin as half-time Associate Priests
- Increase the Youth Minister position to full-time with additional responsibility for Children's Ministry; Alison Feigh has filled this role
- Increased the Sexton position to half-time with weekday hours; Bob Cessna is filling this role
- Increase the Parish Administrator position to full-time with additional responsibility for finance and communication; Maureen Vruno is filling this role

The goal for church programs was \$350,000. To date we have spent \$71,500.

The goal of the Campaign was to add \$250,000 to our Endowment Funds; \$175,000 has already been added to the Saint Paul Foundation Endowment Fund. Additional funds will be deposited as they become available.

We want to thank all the contributors to the Campaign and all the parishioners who worked so hard to make it a success. Contributors with an outstanding pledge will receive a letter and envelope before July 1.
